Congratulations, Hal!





Viewing the Nethercutt Collection

SoCalSACC President Bruce Fuhrman organized a Tour on June 10, 2006 to the Nethercutt Collection in Sylmar, Ca. This collection is owned by J.B. Nethercutt and on display by reservation only. Another group of cars are on display across the street at all times for Free! J.B. and his wife passed away in the last couple of years. The multistory building houses his primary collection and is known as San Sylmar built initially in the early 70's. The Nethercutt's resided in the top penthouse area. Many auto enthusiasts have traveled through this collection as it is a marvel to see. The eclectic collection of cars and music instruments, are only rivaled by the magnificent facilities. The pictures below only touch the splendor of the displays. All cars are functioning and could be driven upon J.B.'s command.

Across the street from San Sylmar is the OPEN display of "excess" cars for unguided tours. Admission is free and behind this building is a fully restored Steam Train Engine, Tender and a private rail car belong to the Huntington family.


After the tour, everyone drove to a nearby Mexican food Restaurant for lunch.


Brass Doors.


Driving Directions: (Traveling South toward San Diego on Interstate 5)

2006 was the year and Truckee was the site for the SACC National Convention!

After experiencing several weeks of high temperatures and humidity (unusual for California) it was a comforting environment at Truckee, Ca., high up in the Sierra's. This old mining town, located on



the north side of Lake Tahoe was an ideal environment to finally relax in some

comforting weather and enjoy our C1's. Over 30 C1's participated with many additional members traveling (by other means than a C1) from the east coast to join us. The first day, Monday, was a traveling day, with a Registration in the evening. It was great time to get acquainted with old friends and new attendee's.

Tuesday, began an entire day devoted to Tech Sessions. Four speakers, including our own Larry Pearson, brought us some "Great" information. John Kennedy spoke first in the morning providing us the C1 information on "Soft Tops" and other C1 cockpit amenities. John K. is a wealth of information, having 50 years of practical experience on fabricating his own soft tops from patterns and special items on installation.

Larry Pearson was the second speaker of the morning. Larry brought the same message about Silicon Brake Fluid to the National as the So Cal Chapter received last Spring. Larry's presentation is available in much more depth on the Chapter Web Site. Although some issues on using the silicon fluid surfaced, these issues are still manageable for using the fluid in our C1's. Incidentally, a article on silicon brake fluid is suppose to be included in the next "On Solid Ground", written by Ken Amrick.

Joe Calcango was our third speaker. Joe received an assignment to celebrate the 50-year anniversary of the 1956 Corvette and discuss the design changes from the 1955 Corvette. This assignment (suggestion) came from Noland Adams and Joe lived up to this task perfectly. Joe extracted picture copies from Noland's Book (a series of 5 books on the Corvette) concerning the chassis 1956 changes. Joe had most '56 owners on the edge of their chairs with all the changes and there was much head nodding in "I agree". Great Talk!! The final speaker of the day was Larry Richter, National Treasurer and a long-time member of NCRS. Larry's topic was preparing your car (and the owner) for NCRS Judging.

Wednesday was Tour Day! Lucy Badenhoop layed out our tour which drove through some beautiful mountain scenery going to Nevada City, Ca.. Elevations reached over 7000 feet during the drive and nearing Nevada City, some of the group divided off to visit the longest covered bridge in US. Others continued on to Nevada City. Everyone eventually arrived in Nevada City and they were on their own for lunch. After lunch most individually traveled back to Truckee or toured further to Grass Valley.

Wednesday evening was the Banquet! The site for this event was Frank's Beach on the North Shore of Lake Tahoe. It was a short 12 mile drive to the event and view's were spectacular. A catered buffet was available and a short program followed. Prior to the evening meal we were entertained by Jack "Doc" Hollada singing and playing his guitar (It must be wonderful to be so talented). Doc, as most refer to him, flew in from Illinois and is National Web Site Webmaster.




National Tech Session's

<u> Larry Pearson – Silicon Brake Fluid</u>









Chip Werstein is in the process of restoring a 1960 Corvette, with historical significance, and during the process, prior to the Body Drop, Chip and owner Vic Preisler held a Tech Session for the membership. Due to the garage size and realizing that the body and frame were nearby, the

amount of individuals had to be held to 20. This Tech Session was labeled as "War Paint"! It was the detailed discussion of the many colors of paint stripes and writing found on C1's acquired during assembly. The stripes represent completion of various steps in the assembly and probably are used as quick reference that the correct part has been installed and a installation process completed.

A more in depth discussion and pictures are shown on the Chapter Web Site, www.socalsacc.com under Tech Sessions and "War Paint".

The car, as described by owner and SoCalSACC member Vic Preisler, was always intended to be a race car. The car was assembled in March 1960 and rushed into service at the Sebring 1960 event held in later March. Pictures below show the car which is being restored to its initial condition.



The above picture, was extracted from a racing book currently displayed at the session. The words from the book associated with the above picture are: "Six Corvettes were entered at Sebring in March 1960, and this car, having its wheels aligned, was driven by Chuck Hall and Bill Fritts to 16th overall and first in class, the Best finish that year". The car achieved a Class win at the event.



The completed frame, minus the engine, is displayed above. Closer examination reveals various colored stripes, letters (OK on rear frame cross member), paint circles on the differential, etc. More detailed views are available on the Chapter Web Site. The car featured Big Brakes of the year along with deflectors on the backing plates for cooling.



Front crossmember "war paint" designates the Build # (364A) off the Build Sheet and the body color (White). Also in this view is the right front air deflector for the brake. Additional paint stripes are found on the tie rod ends and are different colors designating right and left hand threads. Note the gray stripes on the coil spring.



Vic Preisler explains to the audience, using the history chart next to him, the significance of this car. Vic related that it will be preserved into its original condition and shown with a limited amount of racing.

The "A" designation on the Build # indicates a LPO (Limited Production Option) of a 24 gallon fuel tank. When the car was acquired, the fuel tank was still in the car. The car serial # is 4420 (last four digits).



An expanded view of the Big Brakes on the '60. Note the paint stripes on the various parts.



The audience was seated after bringing their own chairs and drinks were supplied. After the session, most went out for a lunch.

Build #'s are found on various areas of the interior cockpit. The large Top Tank '60 aluminum radiator is installed in the engine compartment.
