My Find!.....Jim Lundal

I will begin this article by clarifying that this 1960 Corvette is "not mine" but I came across the car and met the owner recently at a member recruitment picnic being held by our Vintage Chevrolet Club of America (VCCA) in Long Beach.

A little background..... Our regional club obtained about 90 National VCCA members in our South Bay Region. Invitations to a FREE picnic were sent out and the invitee's began arriving at the picnic area parking lot. During noontime I noticed a lady going through our food line and introduced myself and asked her if she got our invitation and what she was driving. When she responded I almost took her food plate away and said I MUST go see this car, her father's 1960 Corvette. The closer I got to the car and her relaying information about the car, food was the furthest thing from my mind.

Her (purposely not named) father bought the car new from Warren Biggs Chevrolet (Vermont & 8th, in LA) and by the serial number, 1189, we're talking early Oct. 1959. The body tag is still on the door post and Corvette relocated the tag to the steering column on 11/23/59. Basically, her father (who passed away a couple of years ago) did his own maintenance and car-care. The ignition shielding was left off probably after the last tune-up, although the lower shielding remains. The engine is 2-4bbl's, hi-lift cam, 270hp and a 4-speed transmission which is validated by the number stamped (F923CU) on the engine block pad. The odometer sits at 48,000 miles but the owner says the speedometer doesn't work and was disconnected (sometime?).

The car still has its original color configuration, windshield washer equipment, Wonderbar Radio and the wide-white bias ply tires purchased by the father about 10 years ago. After a second trip to take more pictures the new owner keeps wanting to find out about the next solid-axle meeting or Tech Session so as

to drive her car. The new owner received the car from not drive a "stick-shift".

Bob shows up at all the SACC nationals and with his wife, Karen, did the Route 66 run in his original '57 Corvette with the Northwest chapter in 2005. Bob's '57 was featured in Bloomington as one of the '57 "survivors" for which it was well suited! He loves our newsletters and had extended an invitation to visit their farm anytime we are in the area. So, when Janice and I got to Rochester, NY, about 25 miles west of their farm in Ontario, NY, we paid them a visit. The attached photos offer a view of an amazing piece of property as well as some interesting Corvette "goodies".

Bob and Karen live on their 340 acre original milking and fruit farm (they now raise horses and hay) complete with silos, barns, garages and a home built c.1840. The north end of the property ends at Lake Ontario and was beautiful in June! Come winter they can ice fish! Bob and Karen collect Mr. Peanut memorabilia and have examples of almost every ad and figurine that were ever produced. They even have an original roaster complete with Mr. Peanut sitting on top of it turning a handle! Bob currently has two 1957 Corvettes: his red driver which is his everyday car that he's owned for 48 years, and a newly purchased '57 "Air Box" big brake Corvette. It does need work! (see photos). It is one of 43 produced to enhance the inlet air flow to the FI engine (which is no longer in his car). Hopefully he will keep us tuned in to how work is progressing on this rare car.

EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING MINUTES SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA CHAPTER, SACC MONDAY. MAY 21. 2007

This Months' Meeting was held at Weiler's Delicatessen in Canoga Park. The Board Meeting was called to order by President Bruce Fuhrman at 6:44pm. The following Board Members were present: Richard Block, Larry Pearson, John Costales, and Chip Werstein. Also present were Jeff Block and Mike Gibbons. Officer Reports:

Copies of the Minutes from the March 19, 2007 E-Board Meeting were e-mailed to the Board Members by Secretary Larry Pearson for review by the Board. There were no corrections. Chip Werstein made a Motion that the Minutes be approved. The Motion was seconded by Richard Block, voted on, and carried unanimously.

Larry reported that he just got an e-mail connection on May 2nd, and needed help to figure out how to get it to work. John Costales generously offered to help Larry learn how to use it.

Bruce Fuhrman, President, reported that our April 14th General Membership Meeting at the Tam O'Shanter Inn worked out very well and we should use this restaurant again. Chip Werstein reported that he made about 50 phone calls to remind the Membership, and would like help with this effort next time. We had 65 attendees, mostly due to Chip's calls. Chip felt that we should make our calls 2-3 weeks before the event. Dick Block felt that Bruce should allocate a calling list of about 15-20 Members among the Board Members. Getting volunteers for security while the General Membership Meeting is going on is a continuing problem. Comp. the dinner? Bruce will try to get two non-Board people to work security.

Bruce will contact National about a tax-exempt status.

Chip Werstein, Technical Events Coordinator, reported that we need some new guest speakers for our General Membership Meetings. Larry volunteered to see about getting Doug Hooper, a well-known Corvette race car driver. Jim Gessner might have access to Joe Frietas.

Chip wants to do the fall Tech Session on Saturday, November 10th. Location to be determined. Possible topics: roller cam motors by Doug Prince; a forum (audience participation) format for cooling problems and their solutions; a topic of his choice by Phil Roche; setting up a shifter; soft top frame adjustment. Leland McCoy, Chapter impromptu events coordinator, has a list of drive-in theaters in our area. Events at these theaters are not "official" SACC events and are not insured by our National insurance policy, unless a request is made for insurance coverage.

Richard Block, Vice President, is working on a possible Chapter event to the Automobile Driving Museum in El Segundo. Richard reported that there will be a car show put on by the Sierra Madre Police Officer's Association on Saturday, June 2nd.

John Costales, Membership Chairman, reports that our Chapter has 112 active Members as of tonight. Us collecting National Dues worked well, but about 40 So Cal Members sent their dues directly in to National. John has a copy of Lucy Badenhoop's National Membership list, which he uses to confirm National Membership. John suggests that we should go after the Chapter non-members in the Southern California area. Should we use e-mail or call or both? John found 33 non-So. Cal. National Members on the National Membership list and had Jim Lundal sent all of them a complimentary copy of The Solid Scoop. John Costales, Treasurer (also), reported that we have about \$4000 in the bank. Dues, 2 years for \$35, 3 years for \$55? This concept probably will not work due to the requirement of National Membership. Newsletter Topics: Bill Zappen, Chapter Member #8, is the next candidate to do a Member Profile. We need technical articles. The next newsletter will be published in late July. Old Business:

2007 SACC National Convention in St. Charles, Illinois, June 11-14: John Costales, Bruce Fuhrman, Larry Pearson, and Chip Werstein plan to attend. Larry will give a presentation on our plans to host the 2009 National Convention in Ventura. We need to see if seed money from National is available to us. Jack Mendenhall's Gas-Up Museum and Dry Lakes Racing Hall of Fame: This is located near Solvang and is being considered for a possible tour on Saturday, October 20th. Larry Wright is investigating. Octoberfest on September 30th: Jim Lundal has prepared a flier. This is open to anyone and is not suggested as an official Chapter event.

New Business:

<u>Santa Ynez Valley Country Tour & BBQ, July 28 & 29, 2007:</u> Fliers will be mailed or e-mailed. The cost for food is \$20 per person.

Malibu Tour on Sunday September 2nd: This event is proposed.

The next Chapter Board meeting is scheduled for Monday, July 23rd at Weiler's Delicatessen in Canoga Park. There being no further business before the Board, Richard Block made a Motion that the meeting adjourn. The Motion was seconded by Chip Werstein, voted on, and carried unanimously. The Meeting adjourned at 8:15pm.

EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING MINUTES SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA CHAPTER, SACC

TUESDAY, JANUARY 16, 2007

This Months' Meeting was held at Weiler's Delicatessen in Canoga Park. The Board Meeting was called to order by President Bruce Fuhrman at 7:25pm. The following Board Members were present: Larry Pearson, John Costales, and Chip Werstein. Also present was Larry Wright.

Officer Reports:

Copies of the Minutes from the September 18, 2006 E-Board Meeting were e-mailed to the Board Members by Secretary Larry Pearson for review by the Board. There were no corrections. John Costales made a Motion that the Minutes be approved. The Motion was seconded by Chip Werstein, voted on, and carried unanimously. Bruce Fuhrman, President, reported that we would like to provide three "Classic" cars for a display at the Pierpont Inn in Ventura on Saturday, March 24th. Bruce will try to get three Corvettes.

Bruce reported that Larry Richter, SACC Treasurer and event Insurance Coordinator, needs at least a 30-day notice of a SACC event requiring an insurance binder so that he can provide the proof of insurance. A discussion followed. John Costales and/or Jim Lundal will make sure that Larry gets a copy of all So.Cal. events fliers, even if proof of insurance is not required.

Bruce reported that we need to send a current So.Cal.
