# So Cal SACC Member Profile

(Editor: This Newsletter we will feature another member of our Chapter Board, Larry Pearson. Larry has held the office of Secretary for 2005 to 2006 and has been re-elected to the same office for 2007. Larry is an interesting personality and I have known him, through other car clubs, for over 15 years. Larry has presented at all our Tech Sessions and is a wealth of knowledge. Enjoy his write-up)

Although my education is in Electronics Engineering, I have always loved all things mechanical: cars, Lionel Electric Trains, clocks, Winchester lever actions, Colt revolvers, antique radios, and pretty much anything put together with screws and bolts.

When I graduated from high school in 1959 and got my first summer job and part time job during college, I needed a car. I loved cars with V-8 engines, but I didn't have much money. So my first car ended up being a 1951 Oldsmobile Super 88 Holiday Coupe with the "Rocket" V-8 and hydramatic, which I purchased for \$300. In 1964, I replaced the Super 88 with a low mileage 1951 98 4-door, which my uncle gave me. I still have this car.

I got my first engineering job with Boeing in Seattle, Washington in 1965. My brother, John, suggested that I needed to buy a Corvette. I determined that the 1962 model was the newest that I could afford, so I went looking for one of those. It <u>had</u> to be Roman Red. I discovered that Seattle was not "Corvette Country", and there was only about one for sale per week to look at. I ended up buying a '62 from Alan Green Chevrolet, the "Harry Mann" of Seattle. Although it was only four years old, it already had 80,000 hard miles on it. But it <u>was</u> red/red, with hardtop only, 250hp, 4-speed, 3:36 Posi., r&h, and chrome wheels, which I thought were "cool". The transmission popped out of second gear, and was basically worn out. I persuaded the dealer to replace the transmission with a new one for no charge under his "OK" used car warranty. The rear end was noisy, so I had the whole carrier assy. replaced with a new 3:70 unit, my cost.

I moved to Greenville, Texas for four years in 1966, where I worked for LTV Electro-Systems. During that time I had the engine rebuilt, added a soft-top, and a custom air conditioning unit by arctic Car. It gets <u>hot</u> in Texas.

I moved to Panorama City in 1970, where I worked for ITT Gilfillan. On November 3, 1971, the Corvette disappeared from the carport, never to be recovered. With the help of Ed Thiebaud in Fresno, I replaced the stolen Corvette with another red/red soft top only car in 1972, also from Seattle! All I could find in LA were Fawn Beige cars. This car was too nice to drive every day, so I kept it in my parent's garage in Burbank. I then bought a 1960 base engine 3-speed, soft top only car in Ford yellow (over the original maroon) in 1973, and then another 1962 white/black 2-top 4-sp Fl (less the Fl) car in 1974. Once you have a Corvette get stolen, you can't have enough spares in case it happens again. I ended up restoring the chassis and engine and engine compartment of the red '62 in 1972-74 (the factory interior and \$200 repaint in 1966 still look great). I won the Sweepstakes award at the 1974 WSCC Convention, Best Restoration of Show at the Ambassador Concours d'Elegance shows and car shows over the next few years. Car shows are a lot of work, and I seldom show it anymore.

In 1975 I discovered a nice all-original 1960 Corvette in a parking lot in Reseda. I went to DMV and paid 75 cents to find out where it lived (it takes a court order to do this today). It lived in Northridge, and I tried to buy it, but the owner wouldn't sell. Over the next 20 years, several times a year I would drive by the house to see if the car was still there. But the garage was always closed. In 1995, I went by one day, the garage door was open, and the car was still there! So I tried again and this time the owner would sell, but the price was about ten times what it would have been in 1975. As it turned out, the owner stopped driving it shortly after I tried to buy it in 1975, and it basically sat unused for the 20 years until 1995. the owner bought it new in 1960 from Malcolm Konner Chevrolet in Caldwell, New Jersey (the "Harry Mann) of New Jersey. He had Corvette News from 1959, the jacket patch, the gold pin in the box, the wallet card, the owners book, clock instructions, radio instructions, the warranty book, receipts for all the work he did to the car, and the original dealer invoice

(He says he never got the window sticker). He traded a 1956 black dual-guad Corvette in on the 1960. he bought the 240-hp engine because he had nothing but trouble with those dual guads. The car is Honduras Maroon with white coves, both tops, 4-speed, 3:70 Posi, courtesy lights, r&h, and white walls. Except for the radiator core, water pump, mufflers, tail pipes, seat covers, and tires, it is all-original. The VCCA (Vintage Chevrolet Club of America) has certified it as original in all four areas in their "Historical Preservation of Original Chevrolet Features (HPOCF) judging program.

I love cars, and currently have 12 of them: 1949 Plymouth, 1951 Oldsmobile, 1955 Cadillac, 1956 Chevy, 1960 Corvette, 2-1962 Corvettes, 1966 Corvette (basket case with nothing in the basket), 1968 Caprice, 1972 Chevy C20 pickup, 1975 Chevy Monza V-8, and a 1992 Camaro. If I had a 100-car garage, it would be full! Can't get enough of them Cars!
